

Chapter 9 – Licenses & Permits 10/21/13

LICENSES AND PERMITS 9.13 (4)

(4) LICENSE FEES. The license fees shall be as follows:

- (a) For the exhibition of a circus or menagerie: \$35.00 per day.
- (b) For the operation of a roller skating rink: \$5.00 per month.
- (c) For the operation of a carnival or other type of entertainment featuring rides or amusements or games of chance: \$25.00 for one day; \$40.00 for two days; and an additional \$10.00 per day thereafter.
- (d) For the operation and maintenance of pool halls and billiard rooms, video game arcades, games, contests or any other type of amusements: \$5.00 per month. No license is to be issued for a period of less than one (1) month. (Am. #83-16; Am. #95-77; Am. #96-19)

(5) TRANSFER OF LICENSE. No transfer of license as to location or ownership shall be granted except after application therefor upon a form provided by the City Clerk who may grant or reject such application after investigation. If the application for transfer is approved, this action shall be endorsed upon the license by the City Clerk.

(6) POSTING OF LICENSE. Every person licensed hereunder shall immediately post such license and keep same posted while in force in a conspicuous place on the premises mentioned in the application for such license. No person shall post such license upon premises other than those mentioned in the application or knowingly deface or destroy any such license. Whenever a license shall be lost or destroyed without fault on the part of the holder or its agent or employees, a duplicate license in lieu thereof under the original application may be issued by the City Clerk. 9.14 CATS. (Repealed #98-23) (Cr.#02-55)

(1) LICENSE REQUIRED.

- (a) Every owner of a cat more than five (5) months of age on January 1 of any year or five (5) months of age within the license year, shall annually, or within 30 days from the date of such cat becoming five (5) months of age, pay a cat license tax of \$5.00 for each neutered male cat and spayed female cat, and \$10.00 for each male cat and female cat that has not been neutered or spayed, or 1/2 of these amounts if the cat becomes five (5) months of age after July 1 of the license year.
- (b) Whereas there is no requirement in the Wisconsin State Statutes for the licensing of cats, all revenue collected by the City for issuing said licenses shall be retained by the City.
- (c) The issuing of said licenses shall become effective with the 2003 license year.

(2) DELINQUENT PAYMENTS. The City Treasurer shall assess and collect an additional \$5.00 from every owner of a cat more than five (5) months of age, as such owner fails to obtain a license prior to April 1 or within 30 days of requiring ownership of a licensable cat, or where such owner fails to obtain a license within 30 days after the cat has reached licensable age.

(3) DEFINITIONS. As used in this Section, unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

- (a) Cat includes all domesticated members of the felis catus, male or female.
- (b) Owner includes any person owning, harboring or keeping a cat, and the occupant of any premises on which a cat remains or to which it customarily returns daily for ten (10) days is presumed to be harboring or keeping the cat within the meaning of this chapter.
